

A few hundred yards from Milton High Street....

You can see or hear more than **30 species of birds** in 90 minutes just south of the High Street.

Local enthusiast Chris Barnes and a group identified 30 different birds on a 90 minute walk on Saturday, 26th April. This included 6 summer visitors - Common Whitethroat, Sedge Warbler, Garden Warbler, Blackcap, Chiffchaff and Swallow.

They didn't see all the birds noted on the earlier walk (April 13th). Nor did they see Snipe or Kingfisher which have been seen there, but they were delighted to see that the rare Cetti's Warbler is still with us and surprised to see a Barn Owl still hunting at 11 am! Happily, this owl has taken up residence in one of the two nest boxes put up by Pat Ward and others – thanks, Pat.
