Delving into the Archives



The Society obtained permanent premises for its Archive in 2022 at the offices of Alfred Groves and Sons in Milton. The Archive consists of a wide variety of documents, photographs, audio recordings and research materials accumulated over the 40+ years of our existence. We continue to add material to the Archive.

Recent items received include:

- A valuable set of documents related to the Groves family including a family diary from the 1879-82 and a set of letters from Thomas Groves from the 1850s plus other material. Kindly donated by Judith Crampton a descendant of Alfred Groves, now living in Yorkshire.
- A set of documents and scrapbooks relating to the history of Ascott and the Tiddy Hall.
- A donation of photographs of Saunders butchers in Milton, the former Fina garage in Shipton, and a country dancing group from Milton in the 1970s
- The donation of an album of photographs from 1912-13 relating to the Sanderson-Furniss family of Chestnut Close, Ascott.
